Avalanche Processes & Leadership

Instructor: Avalanche Level 2 Course is taught by AAA **Certified** Avalanche Instructor Timothy Keating with 35 plus years of mountain guiding experience. Course Curriculum is **Certified and Approved** by [American Avalanche Association](http://www.avalanche.org) Certified **AAA Level 2 Course Curriculum**.

General Description: Avalanche Level 2 Course consists of 24 plus hours of instruction in lecture, video, discussion, and field study in the Mt. Shasta Backcountry. Avalanche Level 2 Course is designed to build on the necessary information and skills developed in the Avalanche level 1 course and then explore deeper into the up to date science behind avalanches. The goal is to give students a more technical understanding how avalanches develop and release so that they might be able to make safer life-saving decisions. Our course is perfect for a variety of winter recreationists; backcountry skiers, ski mountaineer's, snowmobilers, as well as professionals, including; backcountry rangers, ski patrol, and another winter professional working in the out-of-doors.

The Avalanche Level 2 Course is a more advanced field study aimed to give a greater understanding of snow science and how avalanches develop and release. A review of snow mechanics along with avalanche hazards evaluation will be taught through both lectures and hands-on training. The field study portion will focus on the newest snow assessment techniques to help develop robust decision making in the both the front and backcountry. Included in the course curriculum is the most modern advances in avalanche rescue techniques & equipment. Give us a call if you have any questions.

Prerequisite: Level I avalanche course either AAA Certified or Aiare Avalanche Course Level I or equivalent or Level 1 Refresher in last five years & course provider's recommended reading. **Note:** *Level 1 is not to be taken in the same season as Level 2*

Location & Meeting: Meets at our SWS Mt. Shasta Office at **8:00 am** on the first day of the course.

Instructor to Client Ratio: 1:5/6:

What to Expect: Participants will not be traveling fast. We will be skiing/snowshoeing over calculated routes that afford as much in the way of safely accessible avalanche terrain as possible. Stops will frequently be made for discussion of terrain, snow conditions, vegetation, weather, and anything related to avalanches. Your instructor will be thinking out loud, giving reasons for choosing a certain route or for not crossing a particular slope. Participants will put into practice all the techniques of field hazard evaluation.
