General Information: Thank you for registering for your course with SWS Mountain Guides. Itinerary: Day 1 through Day 3 - Class begins at <u>8:00 (sharp!)</u> each day- plan on eight hrs. plus of instruction. Full days of instruction, including the final day of the course.

Location: Your course will be held in and around Mt. Shasta, California. We will be meeting the first day of the course at 8:00 am sharp at the SWS Mountain Guides Office located at 210 East Lake St., Mount Shasta, CA. 96067 (or see attached map in your course materials). **Lodging** maybe available at the SWS Bunkhouse located at our office in Mt Shasta, California please contact us if you are interested.

Food: No meals are included with this course. All meals are your own responsibility- there are several grocery stores and many restaurants in Mt. Shasta. Our office has a Small Kitchen and a regular refrigerator, which will be available for course participants to use.

Lodging: Several motels and hotels are located in Mt. Shasta (see list included in your course materials)

Camping: Camping is available throughout the Mt. Shasta Area (see list included in your course materials)

Showers: Showers are also available on a first come first serve basis in the SWS Mountain Guides Office for those camping in the Mt. Shasta Area.

Level: Beginner to Advanced Participants should be in good physical condition.
